Conclusion of the 16th General Assembly of the Synod on Synodality

A missionary Church who walks with the Lord



arking the conclusion of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod, Pope Francis presided over Holy Mass on Sunday, 27 October, in Saint Peter's Basilica. He gave thanks to the Lord for the "journey we have made together" in the Synod on Synodality that began three years ago with local, regional and continental meetings. The Holy Father encouraged the faithful to be like Bartimaeus and "entrust our blindness to the Lord" in order to be "a missionary Church that walks with her Lord". Indeed, he added, we "do not need a sedentary and defeatist Church, but a Church that hears the cry of the world and gets its hands dirty in serving".

be taken, the report calls for increased transparency in data collection, and highlights imbalances in local Churches regarding the availability of reporting structures and support services for victims. The Commission's first-ever Annual Report on Church Policies and Procedures for Safeguarding, covering the 2023 calendar year, was presented on Tuesday, 29 October. In an interview with Vatican Media, the President of the Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors highlighted the Church's concern with pairing justice with healing, as well as the need to educate people on "how common these crimes are in our world".

Abuse survivor Juan Carlos Cruz said, "we can't move on if people are left behind", adding that everyone should speak out and help survivors – believe them, accompany them, make reparation – to ensure that "the scourge of abuse will never happen again".
